Three groups will receive a color folder containing two visuals and a set of specific document questions. 2. Answer the source-specific questions for each set 3. Discuss the overall guiding inquires. 4. Next the 2 Spain groups will get together and share their findings, add or correct information. 4. After students have examined their document(s) each group will present their findings to the class in carousel by answering the specific questions for their document set (use smartnotebook or on postit paper if available). 5. There is a word bank available for students who need a modified quiz. Assessment: SIOPStrategy- Pairs check Students will get with their seat mate and discuss how to "beef up" their answers.
